Kramer moved, seconded by England, to approve the 2018-2019 Collective Bargaining Agreement for Certified Staff, as presented by the Negotiations Team. Mr. Terwilliger and Chairwoman Bice reviewed the proposal and answered questions of the Board. The proposal included an \$800 increase in base salary, an extra personal day per year – with no personal day buyback, increase sick leave carry-over to 45 days. Voting by roll call: AYES – Kramer, Lostroh, Nutter, Spellman, Bice, England. NAYS – None. Motion 12-2017-82 passed.

Lostroh moved, seconded by Nutter to approve the 2018-2019 Malcolm Public Schools Calendar. Mr. Terwilliger reviewed the calendar and explained the process of input from the teachers. Voting by roll call: AYES – Lostroh, Nutter, Spellman, Bice, England, Kramer. NAYS – None. Motion 12-2017-83 passed.

Bice moved, seconded by England, to approve the employment contract of Paige Getz, High School Resource Teacher. Mr. Terwilliger, Mr. Adams and Mrs. Dolliver reported on the hiring decision. Voting by roll call: AYES – Nutter, Spellman, Bice, England, Kramer, Lostroh. NAYS – None. Motion 12-2017-84 passed.

Administration Reports –

Mrs. Amber Dolliver, Westfall Elementary Principal

- The first semester is ending soon.
- April Faubion will be the new Health Aide starting second semester, due to the resignation of Angela Beekman.
- New science standards for next year will encourage hands-on science knowledge/activities.

Mr. Greg Adams, Jr/Sr High School Principal

- Mrs. Watson's Science class had a Games & Parks speaker, which culminated with students going out to Branched Oak Lake to plant milk weed.
- Second semester Mrs. Watson's class will run an aquatics lab (fish tank) in collaboration with UNL.

Superintendent Ryan Terwilliger

- Malcolm had a great first semester in all activities.
- The first phase of the construction project is wrapping up. The steel bid will be held in February with the contractor bid shortly after.
- Held a meeting with the architect and designers to receive staff input into the furniture and design of the rooms. The configuration of the renovations/additions will give collaborative opportunities for learning.
- Senator Erdman is proposing a property tax relief petition. Our concern is the impact it would have on State Aid and schools like Malcolm that are equalized. Mr. Terwilliger will be monitoring legislative developments.
- Mr. Terwilliger expressed his intent to return next year, as required by statute.

With no further business before the Board, Kramer moved, seconded by England, to adjourn. By acclamation, all voted in favor. Chairwoman Bice declared the meeting adjourned at 7:50PM.
