Hadley Teut Qualifies to Compete at World's Largest Junior High Rodeo



Hadley Teut, an 8th grade student at Malcolm Junior High School has earned a position on the Nebraska State/Provincial National Junior High Rodeo Team and will be traveling with fellow teammates to Lebanon, Tennessee, June 18-24 to compete at the 13th annual National Junior High Finals Rodeo (NJHFR) in the Girls Break-Away and Goat Tying competitions. She was also Reserve All-Around Cowgirl for the State of Nebraska.

Featuring roughly 1,000 contestants from 43 states, five Canadian provinces and Australia, the NJHFR is the world's largest junior high rodeo. In addition to competing for more than \$80,000 in prizes, NJHFR contestants will also be vying for more than \$200,000 in college scholarships and the chance to be named a National Junior High Finals Rodeo World Champion. To earn this title, contestants must finish in the top 20 - based on their combined times/scores in the first two rounds - to advance to Saturday evening's final round. World champions will then be determined based on their three-round combined times/scores.

Again, this year, the Saturday championship performance will be televised nationally as part of the Cinch High School Rodeo Tour telecast series on RFD-TV. Live broadcasts of each NJHFR performance will also air online at NHSRATV.com Performance times are 7PM on June 18, and 9AM and 7PM each day thereafter.

Along with great rodeo competition and the chance to meet new friends from around the world, NJHFR contestants have the opportunity to enjoy shooting sports, volleyball, contestant dances, family-oriented activities, church services sponsored by the Fellowship of Christian Cowboys, and shopping at the NJHFR trade show, as well as visiting area attractions as Lebanon hosts the NJHFR for the second year in a row.

Reason: Seventh Grade Requirements

According to Nebraska statutes, all students entering seventh grade are required to have a physical examination within 6 months prior to the first day of school which is August 15, 2017. If your child plans to play a sport, the physical must have occurred after May 1, 2017 in order to be in compliance with NSAA rules.

Evidence of a visual evaluation by a physician, a physician assistant, an advanced practice registered nurse, or an optometrist, within six months prior to the entrance of the child into the seventh grade, unless the parent or legal guardian submits a written statement objecting to a visual evaluation. The visual evaluation is to consist of testing for amblyopia, strabismus, and internal and external eye health, with testing sufficient to determine visual acuity.

Regarding immunizations, students entering 7th grade will need one dose of Tdap (must contain Pertussis booster) and have two doses of varicella (chickenpox) if they have not had a naturally occurring case of the illness.

All physicals should be turned in to either the high school office or health office by August 8, 2017. Please call the school office or email (angela.beekman@mps148.org) with any questions.

Notice of the Public Facilities Construction & Finance Act Hearing was posted on the front doors of the High School, Westfall Elementary, Administration Building, school website, and the message board of the Malcolm Post Office on Thursday, June 8, 2017.

Chairwoman Bice called the Public Facilities and Finance Act Hearing open at 7:00PM to hear testimony of support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the school district using the Public Facilities and Finance Act to finance, in concert with Educational Service Unit #6, a building project. 

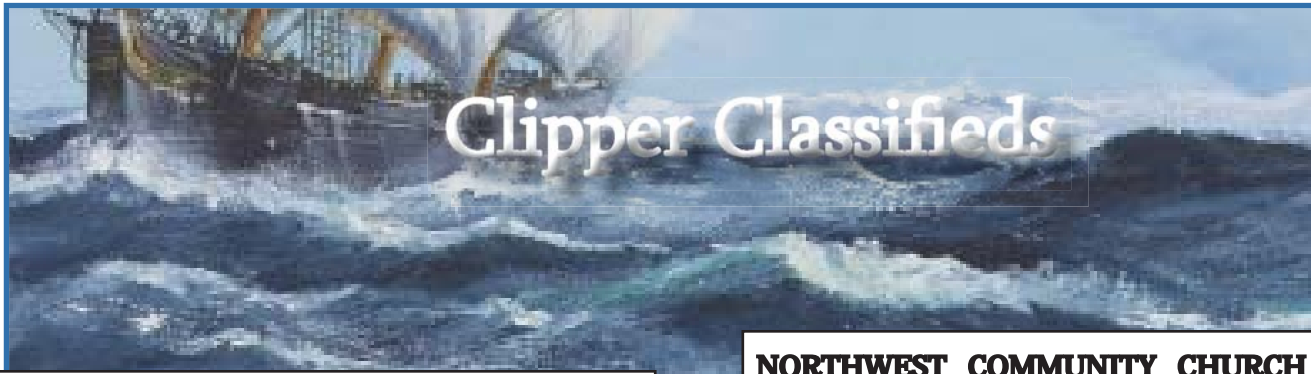
